New MOAJE Board Members

MOAJE welcomes **Danny Watring** and **Dave Dickey** to our Executive Board.

Danny is the new Vice-President. He is the Director of Bands for the Grandview CSD. Under his direction, his marching, symphonic, concert and jazz bands have received numerous superior ratings at District/State Music Evaluative Music Festivals, MO-AJE sanctioned Jazz Festivals, and area marching band competitions. He is a past vice-president for both Jazz and Concert Bands in the Kansas City Metro #3 District and served on the Board of Directors for the Kansas University Kansas City Youth Wind Symphony. Danny served as an All-State adjudicator for eleven years, as well on the Missouri State High School Activities Association Prescribed Graded Music List Committee. He is the founder/coordinator of the Greater Kansas City Middle School Solo and Ensemble Festival. Danny is a member of MBA, MOAJE, MENC, Phi Beta Mu, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. He is on staff with the Missouri Ambassadors of Music and is co-director of Northwinds Symphonic Band.

Dave Dickey is the new President-Elect. He is a trombonist and educator originally from Des Moines, Iowa. Dave received a Bachelors in Jazz Studies from the University of North Texas, including recording 2 CDs with the famed UNT One O'Clock Lab Band. He received his Masters in Jazz Performance from Florida International University. Dave then went to the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign to work on his DMA in Jazz Performance. He currently teaches jazz improvisation at University of Missouri-St Louis, low brass teacher at Saint Charles Community College, and assists with the jazz ensembles at Lindbergh High School. Dave also performs in the St Louis area, teaches a large private low brass and jazz improv studio, writes music, director of the St Louis MetroBones www.slmetrobones.com (14 or the top high school and jazz trombonists and rhythm section players), and director and soloist of the new Dave Dickey Big Band in St Louis www.davedickeybigband.net . He has performed in the U.S. and around the world with well-known jazz, Motown, Rock, and Latin/salsa artists. Dave is the creator and programmer of a popular trombone internet radio show called Grove Bone. www.groovebone.org Dave was a musician and actor for 2 DVDs: Arturo Sandoval's HBO movie "For Love or for Country" and performed and soloed in a documentary DVD/CD on Cuban music called "La Cuba Mia", which featured Celia Cruz, Willy Chirino, Arturo Sandoval, Paquito D'Rivera, Albita, and others.

2011 All State Jazz Band Auditions

We are only a month away from State Jazz Auditions and your District Auditions are right around the corner. Your district Jazz Vice Presidents should be communicating specific dates and times with you regarding district auditions. The state audition materials are posted on our website. Remember to use Set 4. The MOAJE Jazz Etudes by David Aaberg are available at St. Ann Music Publications, Pepper/Wingert-Jones, M-R Music, Shattinger Music, American Music Company, and Music Center of Kirkwood.

State auditions will be held at Columbia Hickman High School on Saturday, December 3rd. A student is eligible to audition for State Jazz Band if they make their respective District Jazz Band and/or Alternates. The audition fee is \$10 per student per instrument per audition. Payment by cash or check will be accepted and checks can by made out to "MOAJE". Purchase orders and/or future payment vouchers will not be accepted. Registration fees have to be paid for all the students that were registered, whether they audition or not. The audition material can be found on our website at: www.moaje.org. Remember supervision of students by a certified staff member of the school district is required for the entire day. 2012 All State Jazz Band Clinician

Chip McNeill

University of Illinios at Urbana-Champaign



In addition to his position with the University of Illinois School of Music, Professor McNeill is Musical Director and Jazz Tenor Saxophonist for Grammy award-winning recording artist, Arturo Sandoval. He has toured with and recorded the compact discs (CDs) Americana and Hot House with Arturo Sandoval. In 1998, Hot House won a Grammy for Best Latin Jazz recording. To his credit, Professor McNeill won a Grammy for his performance on Hot House, and two of his charts were nominated for Grammys from the recording. Professor McNeill also has performed and toured with the legendary jazz trumpeter, Maynard Ferguson, with whom he has produced, written, and performed on several CDs, including Live in London, These Cats Can Swing, and Maynard Fergusonís final CD, The One and Only. He has recorded performances with Nat Adderley, David Liebman, Duffy Jackson, Ira Sullivan, the Woody Herman Orchestra, Ted Shumate, and Larry Willis.

He has performed with Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis, Jr., Joe Williams, Dizzy Gillespie, Billy Eckstine, and Wynton Marsalis. Professor McNeill has performed at the Montreux Jazz Festival in Switzerland, Monterey Jazz Festival in California, and Noto Jazz Festival in Japan. He has performed at Carnegie Hall, Town Hall in Sydney, Australia, and the London Palladium. He also has performed for jazz radio and television productions in Europe, Japan, the United Kingdom, India, and Indonesia. Before joining the University of Illinois School of Music, he was Chair of Jazz Studies at Florida International University in Miami and Virginia Tech University in Blacksburg.
