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### 2014 All State Jazz Band Auditions

State Jazz Auditions are right around the corner and most District Jazz Auditions have already taken place. Your district Jazz Vice Presidents should be communicating specific dates and information with you regarding district and state auditions. The state audition materials are posted on our website at <a href="https://www.moaje.org">www.moaje.org</a>. Remember to use **Set 3**. We are still using Willie Hill's Approaching the Standards vol 1 and Jamey Aebersold's Blues in All Keys vol 42. Remember, we are using the <a href="https://www.moaje.org">MOAJE Etudes (Swing Etude & Latin Etude</a>). These are available from the MOAJE website and available to be downloaded is a PDF file of each instrument, MP3 recording of each part, and a MP3 recording of a full rhythm section. Instructions as to how State Jazz Auditions will be conducted are found on our website.

State auditions will be held at Columbia Hickman High School on Saturday, December 6th. A student is eligible to audition for State Jazz Band if they make their respective District Jazz Band and/or Alternates. The audition fee is \$10 per student per instrument per audition. Payment by cash or check will be accepted and checks should be made out to "MBA". Purchase orders and/or future payment vouchers will not be accepted. Registration fees have to be paid for all the students that were registered, whether they audition or not. Remember supervision of students by a certified staff member of the school district is required for the entire day. Please check our website for information regarding procedures in preparation for the state auditions. MOAJE is very pleased to announce our 2015 All State Jazz Clinician, Steve Wiest. Steve is a multiple Grammy-nominated jazz composer and trombonist who is known world-wide for his fresh cutting edge writing as well as his extroverted virtuoso trombone playing. With a zeal for finding fresh ingredients for his muse, Steve is a true multi-genre persona. As a recording artist, composer/arranger, science fiction author, cartoonist, and educator Wiest is at home with many different and diverse areas of creative endeavor.

Wiest's path to recognition began with a four-year stint with the Maynard Ferguson Band. He then received his Master's in Jazz Studies at The University of North Texas. He became the Assistant Director of Jazz Studies at The University of Texas, then began a 17-year tenure as Director of Jazz Studies and trombone at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. During this time, he was a regular with the Doc Severinsen Big Band.
